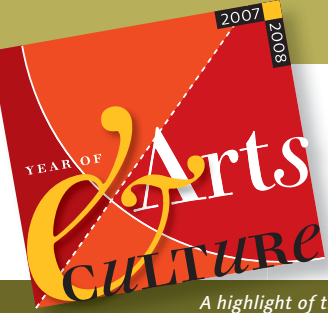


Celebrating a Year of Arts & Culture
